

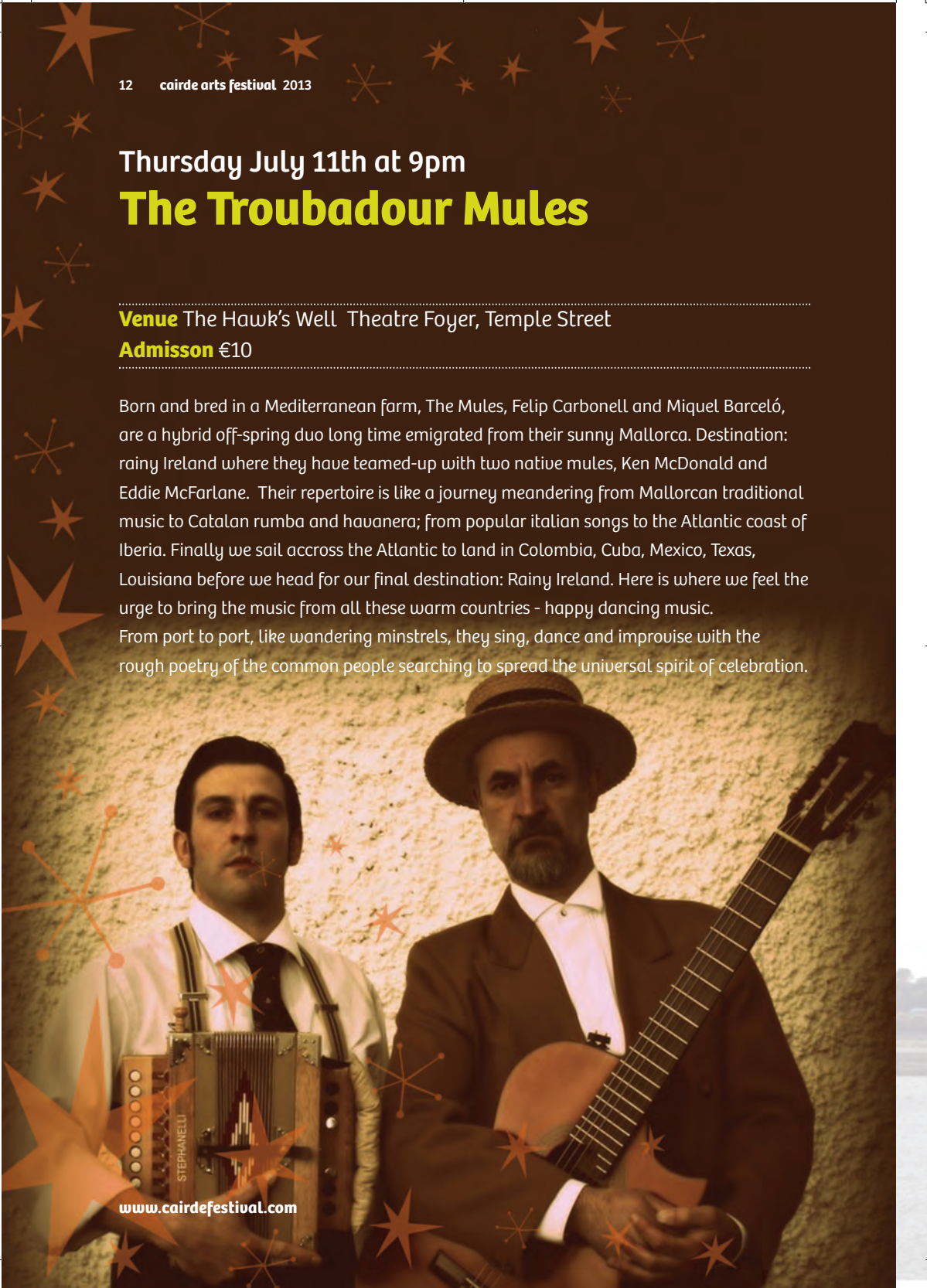
The Troubadour Mules

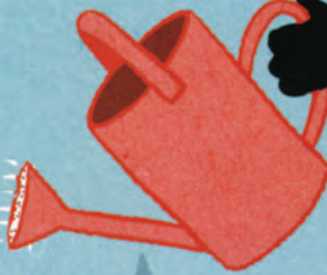
